Message from Our President



What has the Woman's Club of Albany been doing to meet its mission?

WCA members were visible in the community, hosting a table at the Upper Madison Street Fair, volunteering at Cap Rep, marching in <u>"Making Strides Against Breast</u> <u>Cancer"</u> and offering refreshments and house tours to passersby after the walk.

Our historic building is used weekly by Literacy Volunteers of Rensselaer County to teach women Sewing and English Language Workplace Skills, and monthly by the local chapter of Together Women Rise. WCA gardeners have planted 600 tulip bulbs ensuring a beautiful springtime view.

Teen voting advocate Charlotte Powell selected the WCA as a stop on her 300-mile bike ride to raise awareness of the importance of voting and the suffrage movement. The club was delighted to host a reception, a voter-registration table and local media at the house. Read Charlotte's letter below.

The Community Service Committee raised \$200 for the American Cancer Society and collected 78 boxed cake mixes to help FOCUS pantries fill holiday food baskets.

The <u>Fall Fashion Show</u>, sponsored by the Development Committee, earned \$560 and featured WCA models wearing stylish outfits. Proceeds support the WCA and ongoing building maintenance and improvements. Read below for an update on our ADA ramp project. and please consider purchasing and selling cash raffle tickets, a major ongoing fundraiser.

Membership and Program Committee activities brought people together. Outreach efforts continue to bring in new members who support the club's mission and are already participating and volunteering. The WCA is indeed "a center where Capital District women can pool their time, expertise and energy in activities that support the well-being and cultural enrichment of women and children in the region, and to preserve the historic building that is our home."

Thank you to the Board, committee chairs, volunteers and supporters of the WCA. I am proud of the work we are doing.



Saturday -- Jan. 21, 2023 (tentative)


The Program Committee has set a tentative date for a Cabin Fever Wellness Day at the WCA. This day will include a light lunch and wellness sessions by members for members.
