Revival of The Woman's Club of Albany began in 2004, and with it, an ambitious effort to restore our 1895 building, which had suffered severe water damage. Thanks to gifts from members, fundraising, and state and foundation grants, the roof was repaired, the two-story West Bay – with its story-tall stained glass windows – restored, and the ballroom renovated in an enormous effort that resulted in a historic preservation award. Efforts now are focused on raising funds to restore the Main Entrance and Porch, one of our favorite gathering spots in summer. An added benefit will be ADA accessibility to our building, making the WCA more useful to our members and the community.

These planned improvements to our building, coupled with our members' vision and dedication, propel us forward as we undertake a second century of service to the Capital Region. Join us in this important work.
