"Mrs. Packard," presented by <u>Harbinger Theatre</u>, tells the true story of Elizabeth Parsons Ware Packard of Ware, Mass. After being confined by her husband to an insane asylum because she disagreed with him publicly, she became a pioneering feminist by fighting for her freedom. After defending her sanity at trial and being acquitted after 7 minutes of deliberation in 1864, Packard campaigned to ensure the rights of the mentally ill as well as those of married women.
