### Did You Know? The Year Was 1926 . . .

1926 was the 16<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the Woman's Club of Albany and celebrations were in order.

A luncheon was held in the upstairs auditorium for 125 people. A reception was held in November with flowers adorning many rooms and dancing upstairs.

The club now owned an upright piano that was kept in the auditorium for programs and dancing. Another piano was in the drawing room downstairs.

The outstanding club house mortgage was \$5,500 in 1926 against the purchase price of \$20,000. The house's assessed value was \$25,000.
