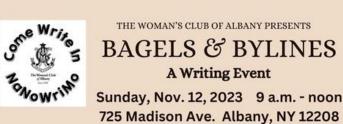
The WCA will open the doors of its historic 1895 building near Washington Park as a "Come Write In" location for NaNoWriMo, or National Novel Writing Month.
